Chairman's Report

Last year the Transplant Unit carried out 50 transplants and this May carried out its first Heart and Lung Transplant in 15 years, which is fantastic news.

As you are all aware, New Start's primary purpose is to raise funds for projects to assist and improve the health and wellbeing of recipients before, during and after transplantation. In pursuing these objectives, during the last year New Start has either provided, or committed to provide, funding for two additional ECMO machines (costing £60,000), some VAD flow pumps and equipment to assist in implanting LVADS

(£26,000), replacement Electrophysiology equipment (£55,000) for use in the Biopsy suite, continuing research into the impact of changing to a Mediterranean diet (£61,000), refurbishment of the bungalows (£95,000) and contributions to the costs of recipients who participate very successfully in the various Transplant Games and Volleyball (£16,000).

We held our Annual Get Together recently at Bowdon Rugby Club and it was great to see so many of you there. It was especially nice to welcome Harry Gorse as he was only 3 and half weeks post - transplant. The raffle drawn on the day

raised a fantastic £4300. The list of winners can be found on our new website www. newstartcharity.org.

The trustees would like to say a big thank you to all who have held fundraising events over the last few months. We have had Danceathons, Ben Nevis Climbs and Ladies Nights to name but a few! British Transplant Games

November 2015

On November 21st 2015, Wythenshawe will be hosting the Transplant Sport UK volleyball (TSUK) tournament. The event has taken place every autumn since 1989 as a satellite event away from the British Transplant Games which are held in the summer.

If you are thinking of getting involved in transplant sport this is a terrific event to get started on. Volleyball is not one of the more commonly played sports in this country therefore the standard is not as daunting as some other events. The emphasis is on fun and having a go. It is a team sport with 6 players on court at a time of which at least one must be female. However, there are normally 2 or 3 females in most teams so it is very much a mixed event. Each team can have a squad of 8 players so there can many substitutions so nobody has to feel they have to play all day. The matches are normally timed to around 10 minutes and with 6 of you to share the effort there is no

need to worry about your fitness levels. So it is a great way to see what transplant sport is all about and gently ease your way in.

Wythenshawe has always managed to enter a team with some considerable success over the years. This year as hosts in Manchester it would be amazing to try and get 2 teams to play representing Wythenshawe. We have a few experienced players who can explain the rules and show you the basics and quide you through the day. There is the option of accommodation, dinner and disco in the evening. This is a great way to finish the day and socialise with your new team mates and opponents you have played during

The purpose of TSUK events is to raise awareness of organ donation and transplantation. New Start will make sure we receive plenty of local coverage as hosts in Manchester. Whenever these events are held the people registering to become



organ donors increases in that area. Therefore, as well as having a memorable fun day (and night!) you can help to spread the word about the shortage of organ donors.



Car Parking

There are new barriers as you approach the Transplant Unit. Please take a ticket and bring it into clinic. Once you are ready to leave the unit, give the ticket in at reception and they will validate it for you. You then need to put this in the exit barrier.

Clinic Times

Monday and Friday are post - heart transplant clinics

Tuesday and Thursday mornings are post lung transplant clinics. (Lung Function is open from 8.30am)

Wednesday mornings we run both heart and lung clinics

Dr Santhanakrishnan will take Wednesday Lung clinic. Dr Al-Aloul will continue on a Tuesday morning and Dr Blaikley Thursday mornings.

Routine Bloods every 6-8 weeks.

Echos, ECGs and X-Rays every 6 months. Please make sure you always have an appointment

We have Echo Slots on:

Monday: 10.00, 10.20, 10.40 and 11.00

Wednesday: 10.00, 10.40 and 11.40

Friday: 10.00 x 2, 10.40 and 11.00

If you are unable to keep your echo appointment, please let us know well in advance so the slot can be reallocated. When attending clinic please could you bring a list of your medication with you.

Patient Bloods

Patients' attending clinic for blood tests only are asked to arrive between 9.30 and 11.00. During busy times it may be necessary for patients to go to the phlebotomy clinic in the main hospital to have their bloods taken. Clinic appointments are limited to a manageable number dependant on how many Doctors are available. If you wish to see a Doctor at your visit please phone the clinic prior to your arrival as it may help avoid a long delay.

If you would like your bloods done locally please speak to the clinic staff.

New Packaging for our Postal Response Service

We are changing our postal response service (blue postal blood boxes) over to a new packaging system. In future the blood bottles will go into a little plastic package which is then placed into a plastic envelope. The postage is still 1st Class and free. The packaging is much less bulky and will fit into any Royal Mail Post box. Please phone Transplant OPD if you have any questions.

Infection Prevention



Please help us to prevent the spread of infection from person to person and place to place.

Always wash your hands with soap and water if your hands are visibly dirty and especially after using the bathroom

Alcohol gel is provided at the entrance to every department and within the departments. Please use it every time you enter or leave a department. Alcohol Rub is as effective as hand washing. However, it does not remove dirt and does not kill some of the gut bugs. That is why hand washing is so very important after using the bathroom
